

Chapter 15

Motor Vehicles and Traffic

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Part 1**General Regulations****§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.**

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for sections or Parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in The Vehicle Code (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81), as amended, except that, in this Chapter, the word “street” may be used interchangeably with the word “highway”, and shall have the same meaning as the word “highway” as defined in the Vehicle Code.

2. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.

§15-103. Provisions to be Continuation of Existing Regulations.

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.

§15-104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

The Board of Supervisors shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:

A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.

B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.

Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter 15 for a

violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

§15-105. Experimental Regulations.

The Board of Supervisors may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the Township of Reading where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this Section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature, and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution; provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Township relative to traffic and parking.

§15-106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.

1. Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.

2. Board of Supervisors shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

3. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-107. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words “assemblage” and “procession” shall have the following meanings:

Assemblage—a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

Procession—a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the Board of Supervisors, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least one week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held, but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least 3 weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the Board of Supervisors, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least 2 weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held, but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least 3 weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have reached the end of the route of the procession and the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.

4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-108. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the Township of Reading are hereby given authority to direct traffic on the highways of the Township and at intersections thereof.

§15-109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.

The Township of Reading Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S.A. §3368. This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Township, be they township, county or state highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to “local authorities” under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §101 *et seq.*, as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General

Assembly of Pennsylvania.

Part 2**Traffic Regulations****§15-201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Streets.**

1. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than 5 miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of 5 miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§15-202. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Bridges and Elevated Structures.

1. Maximum speed limits are established, as follows, on certain bridges and elevated structures, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any such bridge or elevated structure, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that bridge or elevated structure:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than 5 miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of 5 miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§15-203. Maximum Speed Limits Established for Certain Vehicles on Hazardous Grades.

1. The following are declared to be hazardous grades, and, upon any such hazardous grade, no person shall drive a vehicle, having a gross weight in excess of that referred to for that grade, in the direction stated for that grade, at a speed in excess of that established in this Section for that grade, and, if so stated for a particular grade, the driver of every such vehicle shall stop the vehicle before proceeding downhill:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than 5 miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 for each mile in excess of 5 miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§15-204. Maximum Speed Limits Established in Parks.

1. A speed limit of 35 miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the Township, except in the following locations, where the lower maximums, as specified, shall apply:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than 5 miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of 5 miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§15-205. Traffic Signals at Certain Locations.

1. At the following locations, traffic signals as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who disobeys the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-206. Intersections Where Turn Prohibited on Red Signal.

1. The following are established as intersections where drivers of vehicles headed in the direction or directions indicated are prohibited from making a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) on a steady red signal:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-207. One-Way Streets Established.

1. The following are established as one-way streets, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street:

§15-208. Turning at Certain Intersections Prohibited or Restricted.

1. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, of the type indicated, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn into the second-named street, as indicated, at any time when such a turn is prohibited by this Section:

§15-209. Right Turns Only Permitted at Certain Intersections.

1. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make other than a right turn, at any time stated, both left turns and straight-across traffic being prohibited

§15-210. U-Turns Prohibited at Certain Locations.

1. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, traveling upon any of the following portions of streets, in the direction or directions indicated for that street, to make a U-turn:

§15-211. No Passing Zones Established.

1. The following are established as no passing zones, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no passing zone:

§15-212. Through Highways Established.

1. The following highways are established as through highways, thus authorizing stop or yield signs to be erected facing traffic approaching every intersection with the through highway except for those intersections with traffic signals, or with exceptions or modifications as indicated below. Every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop or yield sign authorized by this Section shall stop the vehicle or yield right-of-way as required by §3323(b) or 3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, as the case may be, and shall not proceed into or across the through highway until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§15-213. Stop Intersections Established.

1. The following intersections (in addition to intersections with the through highways established by §15-212) are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the intersecting of through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by §3323(b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the second-named or intersecting or through street until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law.

Part 4

General Parking Regulations

Wherever a space is marked off on any street for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this Chapter for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.

§15-402. Parking Prohibited at All Times in Certain Locations.

1. Parking along a one way or a two way highway in a position other than parallel to the direction of authorized traffic.
2. Parking within an intersection or within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.

4. Parking within 30 feet of any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign or traffic control signal located at the site of a roadway.
5. Parking at any place where official signs prohibit parking.
6. Parking on any roadway.
7. Parking within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station or, when properly sign posted, on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of the entrance.
8. Parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
9. Parking, stopping or standing a vehicle on any Township roadway so as to constitute a safety hazard or unduly interfere with the free movement of traffic.
10. Parking shall be prohibited at all times in the following locations:

§15-410. Penalties and Parking Tickets.

1. Any person who violates any provision of this part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15, together with costs of prosecution.

In regard to any parking violation, the police officer(s) may also leave on the windshield of the illegally parked vehicle a parking ticket setting forth thereon a notice to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle has been stopped or parked in violation of the provisions of this Part 4 and instructing the owner or operator to report to the Township Police Department in regard to such violation or to pay the penalty hereon provided. A parking ticket shall also notify the owner or operator that he or she may place the required fine as marked hereon in such envelope and deliver it to the Township Office in person or by mail within 10 days of the date thereon as a penalty for and in full satisfaction of such violation.

If the applicable penalty is not paid within said 10 days from the time the notice of violation was issued, prosecution will be initiated for said violation, and upon conviction thereof, the driver or operator shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15, together with costs of prosecution.

Part 5

Removal and Impoundment of Illegally Parked Vehicles

§15-501. Applicability and Scope.

This Chapter is enacted under authority of §6109(a-22) of the Vehicle Code¹, and gives authority to the Township of Reading to remove and impound those vehicles which are parked in a tow away zone and in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter. Vehicles which have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code) or which are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others, may be towed under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code. (Ord. 1987-2, 7/16/1987, §15-501)

§15-502. Authority to Remove and Impound.

The Township shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in §15-501 of this Chapter. Provided: no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Chapter, or the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code. (Ord. 1987-2, 7/16/1987, §15-502)

§15-503. Tow Away Zones Designated.

The following designated streets and/or parking lots are hereby established as towaway zones. Signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that their vehicles may be towed for violation of the Township parking regulations:

§15-504. Designation of Approved Storage Garages; Bonding; Towing and Storage.

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Chapter shall be done only by “approved storage garages” that shall be designated from time to time by Board of Supervisors. Every such garage shall submit evidence to Board of Supervisors that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to Board of Supervisors as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garage keeper for the purpose of

towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to Board of Supervisors its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Chapter, and, when the schedule is approved by Board of Supervisors, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage; no different schedule of charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Chapter by any approved storage garage. Board of Supervisors shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Chapter.

§15-505. Payment of Towing and Storage Charges.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Chapter for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§15-506. Reclamation Costs.

In order to reclaim his vehicle, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs, plus a \$25 fee of which \$10 shall be transferred to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation by the garage to which the vehicle was taken.

§15-507. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The Township of Reading shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Chapter and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

§15-508. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Chapter or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

§15-509. Penalty.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 together with all costs of disposing of the vehicle under provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. §§7301 *et seq.* (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

§15-510. Reports and Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles.

If after a period of 15 days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with §7311 of The Vehicle Code, by the person having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after 30 days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed Salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code (75 Pa C.S.A. §§101 *et seq.*, as amended).

Part 6**Snow and Ice Emergencies****§15-601. Declaration of Snow and Ice Emergency.**

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named pursuant to this Part 6, the Board of Supervisors or its designated agent, in its discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this Part 6 as a “snow emergency”). Information on the existence of a snow emergency may be given by the township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

§15-602. Parking and Driving Restrictions.

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated pursuant to this Part 6.

B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

§15-603. Snow Emergency Routes.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule A, attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as snow emergency routes.

If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this Part 6, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part 6 and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in Paragraph 3 herein.

2. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this Part 6, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part 6 and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in Paragraph 3 herein.

3. Removal and impounding of certain vehicles.

A. This Part 6 is enacted under authority of §6109(a)(22) of the Vehicle Code and gives authority to the township to remove and impound vehicles that are parked overtime on any street in the township, or in metered and unmetered parking lots in the township, in violation of any provisions of this Part 6.

B. The township shall have the authority to remove and impound or order the removal and impounding of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally,

provided that the circumstances of its parking Were within the conditions stated hereinabove of this Part 6 and provided that no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part 6.

§15-605. Violations and Penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. §101 *et seq.*) or except as herein specified, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this Part 6, or any supplement thereto, shall be liable to a penalty of \$25 and costs of prosecution.
